The Board of Adams County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, October 15, 2012, with the following members present: Brian Baldridge, Justin Cooper, and Roger Rhonemus. Clerk Diane Ward was also present.

It was moved by Roger Rhonemus and seconded by Justin Cooper to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

Judge Brett Spencer and Court Administrator Angela Richmond met with the board to discuss the following:

- Upstairs restroom facility improvements—a secure stall is needed for female staff and an outdated two sink area needs replaced at an estimate of \$10,000.00. All female employees will have a key for access. 600 to 800 women a year are tested for drugs in the restroom. The employees are requesting to use the jury room or judges' restrooms because of Hepatitis C and other contagious diseases. Some just go home for lunch for restroom facilities. The IV-D program is still on target, bond forfeitures and fees are still on target. 5% of the bond is retained by the county; some have completely forfeited their bond. The court is more than offsetting the requested cost of improvements with the \$60,000.00 to \$85,000.00 which comes into the county. Female staff members need a safe haven for restroom facilities. The court will send a proposal to help offset the expense. The board questioned if there was anything to assist the staff with testing and Judge Spencer informed them that there is nothing other than the ideal situation of having a separate facility for drug testing, which is not feasible.
- Peebles Elementary reading grant program for tutoring to assist kids in the 2nd or 3rd grade. A grant of 1,500.00 from the Special Account was given to the elementary.
- Pat Mason has apparently taken over Christmas Decorations for West Union and the courthouse square, the judge donated money to it. She does not have any electricity out at the poles. She needs electric service on the courthouse square. The board informed Judge Spencer that the poles were inspected by a certified electrician and nothing can be done with the courthouse lights because of the voltage/wattage. Judge Spencer was instructed to have Ms. Mason meet with Sally Hayslip to discuss the lighting.
- Painting the stairwell and working with the Historical Society to procure black and white prints to
 be hung in the second floor hallway. The court brings in 50% of its income from grants and other
 revenues whereas the other office holders do not have that ability. That is why the court can
 assist the county with improvements.
- Courtroom 2 needs new carpeting. Courtroom 1 and chambers can wait until later for new carpeting.
- Law Library relocation and down-sizing
- Pilot program for juvenile education

- Recommended a small conference area under the steps for County Court
- Grant Recovery Program space Judge Spencer expressed his appreciation to the board for allowing them the additional space. The grant on the Recovery Program is going very well \$327,000.00. The court will receive incentive funding if it hits the target for eligibility to continue the grant. It is a phenomenal program and relatively successful. Of the six participants placed in the job market, only one walked off the job. They all have received their GEDs and have tested clean on drugs. Of the 17 job openings, 1/3 of the openings were promised for the program participants and of the 6 participants that were placed only one left. Of the 11 general citizens employed, only 3 of them remain employed.
