COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ASSOCIATION OF OHIO MEETS WITH BOARD

CCAO Executive Director Larry Long, Deputy Director of Operations Tom Stroup, and CEBCO representative Doug Faust met with the board to discuss the following:

- Zoning & subdivision establishment procedures/ township & county-wide
• Motor Vehicle \$5.00 tax increases - 1st 5.00 increment split/30% to townships, 50% to villages, 20% to county; 2nd \$5.00 increment - 30% to township and 70% to county
• Hospital Bond Debt - the board members thanked the CCAO for assistance w/the hospital issues pertaining to the \$20 million hospital bond debt. The current sales tax for the benefit of the hospital expires December 2015.
• Jail overcrowding, Medicaid benefits, and drug problem within the county. Benefits are not allowed once incarcerated and reinstated once the inmate is released from jail. Ankle bracelet contracts and housing inmates at other facilities was also discussed. A round table discussion including CCAO representative John Luetz, Adams County Sheriff, Probation Department, County and Common Pleas Judges, and Prosecutor was suggested. The State of Ohio is in the process of adopting new jail standards which may have an effect on staffing ratios and direct layout.
• Taxes - 2 ways to raise money - sales tax /expanding base state income tax. Internet sales tax will have an impact on the smaller counties. CCAO is in joint testimony with the Auditor's Association/calculation from 1.69% to 2.52%. Also discussed splitting out the Hold Harmless for small counties and the County Bridge fund.
• CEBCO - County Employee Benefits Consortium of Ohio Doug Faust has now been with the program for 3 weeks. Mr. Faust was over the PERS Retirement Plan program and a healthcare program for the school systems prior to being employed at CEBCO. The consortium was created almost ten years ago to average out the highs and lows of group experience rates for group purchasing. Currently, there are 26 counties that are participating. Anthem, CVS Caremark, Delta Dental, and Vision Service Plan are provided to group members. Employee incentives for completing health assessments and standard health maintenance checkups were discussed. CEBCO is transparent as can be on the cost of insurance. CEBCO offers the option of serving as a county broker or allowing the county to retain a broker. CEBCO is looking to the future to see what can be provided over the next decade. The average renewal program-wide for 2013 was 6.2% increase. Rate stabilization and increases are for the group as a whole. Rates are based before the prescription drug rebates. Rebates are given back to each county according to relevance. Annual renewal meeting is the first part of October when the rates for the following year are released. CEBCO has a required three-year term which includes a wellness program to control costs. Mr. Baldrige explained the current Adams County health employee benefits. The county became proactive by establishing an insurance fund to offset claims and rate increases.

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JFS Director Sue Fulton met with the board to discuss personnel, grant agreements, contracts, and the procurement procedure plan update.
