exceeding eight-tenths (8/10ths) mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to eight (\$.08) cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation for ten (10) years a renewal of an existing tax of .8 mills commencing in tax year 2011, first due in calendar year 2012, which will be placed on the November 8, 2011 General Election ballot. The floor was opened to the following discussion:

Mr. Baldrige stated that after going to the ACDD board meeting and discussing their future needs and their possible projected cuts, the ACDD board unanimously felt the need to request the renewal levy be placed on the ballot for the people to decide.

Mr. Cooper - My position on this tax levy has nothing to do with the children or individuals that are being cared for by our local DD. I truly believe that the program is a much needed and a highly valuable operation.

The reason I do not support placing this proposed tax levy on the ballot is due to the expenditure and revenue history. The board of DD receives three tax levies from our constituents of the county, along with other outside money. The current account balance is sufficient enough to carry DD for greater than a year with zero revenue received during the same period. With this very large account balance, along with the fact that monies from DD are being used to invest in the stock market, I have a very difficult time supporting such a measure.

During discussions it has been outlined that there will likely be some outside money reduction, and the request is a safety if that were to occur. I would support such a levy if or when the time came that additional money were needed.

Another item of concern that I have is the fact that the forecast budget for personnel includes yearly raises of 3% plus tenure step increases, as well as a continuation of 100% paid insurance for the employees. This type of aggressive salary schedule and insurance is perhaps acceptable in good economic times, however with unemployment being what it is and so many families barely making it, this is a bit much.

It has been said that we should not undermine the DD board that has made this tax levy request, however I believe that it is not only our duty but our purpose to cross examine every facet of government which we have involvement with.

I believe that the current levy should be removed, and if needed at a later time reintroduced. Our job as government must be to ensure tax payer money, no matter how large or little, is being utilized to the fullest of potential. I firmly believe that government should never invest in high risk markets such as the stock market, and by doing so only signifies that too much money exists at the disposal of a government entity.

Sheriff Kimmy Rogers and Melody Myers met with the board to discuss personnel and funding. Enough money is available on a purchase order for July for food but no money is available for gasoline. An estimated \$64,000.00 is needed to carry them through the end of the year.
